Bridge Formula Program – SD City Bridges & Scour Mitigation



- Nearly \$57.6M per year for Oklahoma
- Minimum of 15% to offsystem



ODOT's plan for off-system bridges:

- >\$15M per year for scour mitigation (city & county)
- >\$10M per year for city bridges
- >\$3M per year for engineering

ODOT will invest \$140M on off-system bridges over the next 5 years



Requirements for consideration:

- Must be structurally deficient
- Must be within city limits
- Must be 20' in length and have an NBI number





Notice of Interest

- Not a guarantee of funding
- Considerations
 - Is it load posted?
 - Is it a bus route
 - ADT
 - Population



Municipal Road Drilling Activity Fund (MRDAF)

- Financial assistance to repair roads damaged by oilfield activities
- > \$5M per year
- ➤ Population under 15,000
- > 75/25 cost share (in-kind contribution not allowed)
- > Applications open through Sept. 30





Application

- Contact information
- Population at 2020 census
- Road name & length of repair (ex.- Main St. 0.25 miles from 1st to 4th)
- ADT (average daily traffic), if known
- Is the road a designated truck/heavy traffic route?
- Estimated cost
- Map of oil activity within 5 miles
- Signed resolution





State Fiscal Year 2023 Awarded:

- All \$5M available funds
- Will repair 16.67 miles of roadway
- Awarded 19 projects to15 communities




Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) Funded provided through the IIJA Bill - Competitive Application Process

\$52 million in projects were awarded funding in 2022



Safety Components of TAP

- ADA compliant sidewalks and trails
- Bicycle infrastructure
- Pedestrian and bicycle signals
- Traffic calming techniques
- Streetscapes or Enhancements
- Lighting and other safety related infrastructure






TAP PROCESS PRIOR TO AWARD

- TAP Projects are Awarded Through a Competitive Application Process
 - Current funding (fully allocated) is provided by the IIJA Bill.
 - During the application process, ODOT Local Government staff provides technical assistance and guidance
 - Applications are completed on-line
 - Application scoring criteria is provided in the Implementation Manual
 - Applications are scored by committee and recommended for award to the ODOT Senior Leadership and Transportation Commission
 - Transportation Commission awards projects at ODOT Commission Meeting












Community Pride – Downtown Revitalization – Safe Routes to Schools – Pedestrian Safety

HOW TO BE PREPARED FOR THE NEXT ROUND(Early 2024)

- Create a plan
- Walking audit/walkability study
- Start coming up with a project description
- Design estimate (based on most current cost estimates)
- Build community support/Involve the public



Access Roads – Industrial and Lake Access

- Purpose is to provide public access to lakes and recreation areas and industrial areas
- State funds
- Available to municipalities and counties
- Resurfacing only
- Work done at the local level




Emergency Relief Program



- ✓ Must be a minimum of \$700,000 (federal share) in damage from event
- ✓ Provides assistance for emergency and permanent repairs
- ✓ Damage must be on a major collector road or higher
- ✓ Make sure damage is thoroughly documented before and after repairs are made
